### Comments on the course evaluations

Five students out of 22 answered which is not representative. But these 5 were pleased with the course and their own learning process and final results.
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The problems surrounding individual work versus group work were also discussed in class. Since this is an elective course, the students visit other courses in parallel which leads to many time collisions. The labs were earlier done individually, which was felt as being too difficult. This is why we now have groups from the beginning. It is still possible for students to do the labs and the project individually.

Seems like the work shops are appreciated. As a student mentions, a problem is that I cannot help different groups simultaneously. More teachers could solve this, however it is hard to plan since it depends on the number of students and on the number of groups actually participating at the work shops.

I agree that the examination seminars where the groups and the individual students can present their work and we can discuss questions or misconceptions together did work out very well. For me as a teacher, it gives me the chance to spend more time with the students and getting to know them better than in the usual set up, which is simply more rewarding and fun.
