Summary of the students' course evaluations

The students' views are objectively summarised here based on the various course evaluations for the course (see above). Individuals may not be named in the course report.

There are five (5) respondents and four (four) are very happy about, achieving the learning objectives, the methods used, the examination form (a thesis) and meeting expectations.

One (1) of the students is an extreme outlier and very negative in all five answers (questions 1-5), however on question 6, no comment is found indicating why the respondent is negative.

Summary of the evaluations of the teaching team

The views of the teaching team regarding the content, learning activities and summative assessment of the course are summarised here.

Text from the Master in Pedagogy (not in higher education teaching and learning):

The student sends the approved thesis as a pdf file to the examiner. The student

then also enter information about the work and upload the same pdf file in DiVA.

The examiner sends the approved degree project with grades to

study administrator. Study administrator reviews the data in DiVA and approves the registration. If further changes have been made to the essay text, the administrator also uploads a corrected file obtained from the examiner.

Analysis

The analysis is based on a summary of the students' and teachers' individual and joint course evaluations. Both success factors and problems are identified.

The teaching team together with the course administrator, need to find well-working routines for the Thesis, e.g. publishing on Diva.

Action plan

The short-term and long-term changes that are to be implemented are specified here, along with a timeline. If no action is planned to address a specified problem, this decision must be justified.

The teaching team will discuss and decide how to arrange routines for the Thesis course before next course is arranged. (Planned time is kick-off for CAKL in August 2023).
