Some of the learning and teaching methods used in class are very useful and accessible to some people, but less to others. It was at times very difficult to engage in discussions and take part in active learning without any outreach from the teacher. Most other courses at MAU include a lot of interactive learning like group work, call and response and other methods where the student is actively given some sort of role and prompted to participate, so being used that kind of teaching made the more free, open forum of this class feel a bit inhibiting. An improvement to this, I think, could be an increased use of the teacher as a facilitator for discussion/debate/learning, by engaging those students that are perhaps more hesitant to speak up on their own, and/or by implementing variations to the lecture style, e.g. with group work, smaller discussions, exercises etc.
