Summary of the students' course evaluations:

students overall feel that they have achieved the course's intended learning outcomes. Some emphasize that they have gained much more than they had expected, their general expectations have been met fully or beyond that :)

The working methods and learning activities of the course are appreciated much by the students, only for the text seminars more detailed instructions are asked for. Student led project work and organisation of work-loads etc have been understood as invitation to take responsibility for own / individual learning.

The examination forms of the course worked well.

Summary of the teacher's views/Results:

Teachers are satisfied with the structure and coordination of the course's parts. Students' progress and results are considered generally good, individual students did show exceptionally good progress during the duration of the course.

Active student participation in online-lectures and seminars could be more, but cannot and should not be enforced. Student-interaction and general contribution to workshops, reflections, debates are considered very good for this group of students. But for this term, the comparatively high number of students who have not finished the course has to be noted - a development we have seen in several courses, so this seems to be not caused by this very course.

Analysis:

Students and teachers are generally satisfied with all of the course's parts. Students' progress and results are considered good.

Active student participation in online-lectures and seminars could be more, but cannot and should not be enforced. Action plan: While no wider adjustments are needed, the text-seminars will be introduced and framed by more clear reading instructions so that students can still develop their own understanding of texts while being led into how to approach these texts strategically.
