Concerning question 1) "To what extent do you consider you have achieved the learning objectives of the course?", students agreed that they had to a large or relatively large extent. Mean 4.2/6.

As for question 2) "To what extent do you think that the working methods/learning activities on the course have reinforced your learning and your ability to achieve the learning objectives?", student gave an average grade to the course. Mean 3.8/6.

Regarding question 3) "To what extent do you consider that the types of examination on the course gave you the opportunity to show how well you had achieved the learning goals?", students agreed that they did to a large or relatively large extent. Mean 4.8/6.

Concerning question 4) "To what extent do you consider that the course as a whole has met your expectations?", students stated that it had to a large or relatively large extent. Mean 4.2/6.

As for question 5) "To what extent has the course given you the opportunity to take responsibility for your own learning?", students agreed that it had to a large, relatively large or very large extent. Mean 5.2/6.

The only additional comment was that the course had few lectures.
