

Forms of evaluation

In the course, there is an ongoing dialogue about the teaching content and methods through students' submitted written reflections after workshops. This concept is meant as feedback for the professors during the course, as well as it is a pedagogical reflection for the students on what they have been through how they connect this with course literature, and what and how they want to move further in the subject and skills. At the end of the course, the summative evaluation takes place at the last seminar. The different moments of the course are recalled together, each student thinks of some highlights and challenges and then discusses them with peers in smaller groups. The group share some of their reflections with the whole group and lastly, each student makes the online evaluation.

Final comments:

To conclude I would like to say I really enjoyed the Outdoor Pedagogy course as it turned out to be much more practical as I thought and showed me new perspectives for my educational career. I really enjoyed the course and that we were such a small and international group.

Summary of the evaluations of the teaching team

The course was completed smoothly with good progression, which was facilitated by good experiences from the previous years. One quality is to follow the development of the students, who are often inexperienced about outdoor pedagogy at the start but develop both theoretical and practical knowledge and commitment. The literature works better for those who are more used to reading academic texts. The weather is a challenge, especially at the beginning of the course. The various guest teachers are an appreciated feature, and it would be nice to be able to develop more, but are limited by the number of hours for the course. The interaction between practice and theory is experienced by both teachers and students as a strength in the design of the course.

Analysis

The overall design of the course works well
The balance of theory and practice is appreciated
The practical workshops are key elements as a main quality of the course
Guest lectures with different expertise areas are desirable
The risk analyses may be expanded into two different workshops
We may need to consider the form and time for the case study

Action plan

To next year's course, we should consider changing the order of the case study and the portfolio work, pros and cons?
